What you need to know...

Applications have been split into 'Small Pot' and 'Big Pot'. Small Pot applications are for £2,000 and under. Big Pot applications are between £2,001 and £20,000.

On Saturday 17th July all applicants will have an information stall about their project. Everybody applying has also completed a 'project summary' and those are in this pack. Based on this information, local residents who attend the event will score each project.

Funding for this initiative has been provided by Scarborough Borough Council, The Northern Area Committee and North Yorkshire County Council.

Organisations were asked to meet at least one of the following priorities. All of the applications in this pack meet the criteria for the fund. It is now up to local people which they wish to see funded.
